



The Greenways are **old disused railway routes reused as ecotourism itineraries**, suitable for walking, cycling or non-motorized systems (skates, wheelchairs, baby chairs ...).

Currently there are 2,500 kilometers of passable Greenways in Spain, of which **26 routes** are located in Andalusia, totaling around **500 kilometers**, which is around 20% of the total.



These **Greenways** are the result of the actions developed by the state administrations, Junta de Andalucía and different local administrations, within the framework of the Greenways Program ([www.viasverdes.com](http://www.viasverdes.com)). Moreover, the development of new Greenways on nearly 1,000 km of obsolete railways existing in Andalusia continues to be promoted.

These infrastructures are suitable for the practice of **active and sustainable tourism**, contributing to promote non-polluting friendly mobility and healthy lifestyle among citizens.

Thanks to its railway origin, Greenways offer conditions of **maximum accessibility** and ease, guaranteeing its journey with little physical


effort by all types of users, including people with reduced mobility (children, elderly, and people with disabilities ...).



They are safety routes, where traffic is not allowed with motorized vehicles, and very attractive, since they usually run through rural landscapes of great natural beauty

The Greenways are itineraries full of magic, dotted with impressive tunnels and spectacular viaducts through which trains once circulated. Some even run on railroad tracks whose works were unfinished, for which the train never got through. It is possible to access by train some Andalusian Greenways.

Today, many of those old stations has been reformed and offer information services, accommodation, catering, bicycle rental, sale of local products ... or are interesting information centers that complement these historic tours.



This edition aims to promote the knowledge and use of the Andalusia Greenways, promoting ecological mobility and active tourism in citizens, while boosting crossed regions and creating employment at the local level.

## HUELVA

### 1 GW Guadiana

Among the mountains of Huelva in the Western Andévalo.

- 16,7 km.
- Compacted soil.
- Among el Puerto village of la Laja and the village of La Isabel.
- El Almendro and El Granado.



### 2 GW Litoral

From the Odiel riverbanks to the Portuguese river border of Guadiana, crossing a rich natural marsh area.



- 49,4 km.
- Compacted gravel.
- Between Ayamonte and Gibraleón.
- Ayamonte, Isla Cristina, Lepe, Cartaya, Gibraleón.



### 3 GW Molinos del Agua

Through an old mining train from the riverbanks of the Tinto river to the gorges of the Serranía de Huelva.



- 34 km.
- Asphalt and compacted gravel.
- Between San Juan del Puerto and Valverde del Camino.
- San Juan del Puerto, Trigueros, Beas and Valverde del Camino.



## CÁDIZ

### 4 GW Entre Ríos

From Rota to Sanlúcar, by Chipiona.



- 16,2 km.
- Asphalt and gravel.
- Between Rota and Chipiona municipalities.
- Rota and Chipiona.

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### 5 GW Matagorda

By the Metropolitan of Toruños Garden and Algaída pine forest.



- 3,60 km.
- Gravel and hanging wooden bridge.
- Between the Toruños Garden and Algaída pine forest, Puerto Real.
- Puerto Real.



### 6 GW Puerto Real - San Fernando

A journey through the natural park Bay of Cádiz.

- 7,90 km.
- Gravel.
- Between Puerto Real and San Fernando municipalities.
- Puerto Real and San Fernando.



## CÁDIZ/SEVILLA

### 7 GW Sierra

A tour through the natural areas of the Béticas mountains.



- 36 km.
- Olvera-Navalagrulla (8 Km): Asphalt. Navalagrulla-Coripe (12 Km): compacted gravel (with small tar irrigation). Coripe-Puerto Serrano (16 Km): compacted gravel.
- Between Olvera and Puerto Serrano.
- Olvera, Coripe, Puerto Serrano, Montellano and El Coronil.



## SEVILLA

### 8 GW Las Lagunas

In the geographical Andalusia center.

- 7,2 Km.
- Gravel.
- Between La Roda de Andalucía and Pedrera.
- La Roda de Andalucía, Estepa and Pedrera.



### 9 GW Itálica

Old road on the ruins of a Roman Empire.

- 2,75 km.
- Asphalt and compacted gravel.
- Between Sevilla and Camas municipality.
- Sevilla and Camas.



### 10 GW El Ronquillo

Among the Minilla reservoir banks and the Rivera Valley of Huelva.



- 9,2 km.
- Compacted gravel.
- Between the old railway station of El Ronquillo (N-630 road, Km 775) and Sevilla-Huelva border.
- El Ronquillo.



### 11 GW Sierra Norte de Sevilla

The most winding path of the Sevilla North Mountains.



- 18,7 km.
- Island Margarita-Cordel of Cazalla Recreation Area (4 Km): compacted soil. Cordel de Cazalla-Cerro del Hierro (14,7 Km): "slummy" asphalt.
- Between Cazalla station-Constantina and Cerro del Hierro.
- Cazalla de la Sierra, Alanís, San Nicolás del Puerto and Constantina.



## SEVILLA/CÓRDOBA

### 12 GW Campiña

A suggestive itinerary from the Caliphate capital through the countryside of Córdoba and Sevilla.



- 84,5 km.
- Compacted soil and gravel.
- From the Azud de Casillas in Cordoba until Marchena.
- Córdoba, Guadalcázar, La Carlota, Écija, La Rambla, La Carlota, Fuente Palmera, La Luisiana, Fuentes de Andalucía y Marchena.



## CÓRDOBA

### 13 GW Fuente Obejuna

Stage for a theater play by Lope de Vega.

- 4,5 km.
- Compacted gravel.
- 1,5 k from the beginning of Fuente Obejuna road until Los Blazquez.
- Fuente Obejuna.



### 14 GW Peñarroya-Pueblonuevo

An itinerary through an old mining and industrial landscape.

- 3,2 km.
- Polished concrete.
- From Peñarroya Station to Andalusia Avenue.
- Peñarroya-Pueblonuevo.



### 15 GW La Maquinilla

A journey into the heritage of one of the most important industrial areas in Spain.



- 8 km.
- Compacted soil.
- From industrial Area of San Antonio (Belmez) to the Industrial Siege of Peñarroya-Pueblonuevo.
- Belmez, Peñarroya-Pueblonuevo.



### 16 GW La Minería

A journey through the Pedroches Valley.

- 14,2 km.
- Compacted soil.
- El Soldado Station and Castillo de Mala Salsa.
- Villanueva del Duque and Hinojosa del Duque.



## CÓRDOBA/JAÉN

### 17 GW Aceite

From the Subbética From Córdoba to the dominions of the olive grove.



- 128 km.
- Compacted soil and asphalt.
- Between Jaén and Puente Genil.
- Jaén, Torre del Campo, Torredonjimeno, Martos, Alcaudete, Luque, Baena, Zuheros, Doña Mencía, Cabra, Lucena, Moriles, Aguilar de la Frontera and Puente Genil.



## JAÉN

### 18 GW Segura

By the limits of Andalusia. In the Segura Mountains.



- 26,9 km.
- Compacted gravel.
- Among Arroyo del Ojanco and the provincial boundary of Jaén with Albacete in Villarodrigo.
- Arroyo del Ojanco, Segura de la Sierra, Génave Bridge, La Puerta de Segura, Génave and Villarodrigo.



### 19 GW Vadollano

From Linares to the place of Vadollano among a landscape hill of olive trees.

- 6,80 km.
- Soil, gravel et ballast.
- Between Linares and the place of Vadollano.
- Linares.



### 20 GW Linares

The winding down of Linares until Guadalimar.

- 6,6 km.
- Compacted gravel.
- From Linares (Barriada San Gonzalo) and from the path of Arquillos (N-322, Linares Baeza station).
- Linares



### 21 GW Guadalimar

From the forest gallery of the Guadalimar river to Guadalquivir Vega olive trees.



- 15 km.
- Asphalt and compacted gravel.
- Between Linares station and Vereda de Pajareros.
- Linares, Iberos, Lupión, Torreblasscopedro and Begijar.



## GRANADA

### 22 GW Sierra Nevada

By the banks of the Genil river, an acces to the best way to the highest peaks of the peninsula.



- 1,65 km.
- Gravel.
- Among Güejar Mountains (also known as «la Fabricuilla» located at the end of Canales reservoir).
- Güejar Mountains.



### 23 GW Sierra de Baza

A route along the foothills of the Granada Altiplano, in old Bastetania.



- 16 km.
- Compacted gravel and asphalt.
- Baúl section: from Baúl to the municipality limit of Freila. Baza section: from municipality limit of Zújar and Caniles limit.
- Baza and Caniles.



## ALMERÍA

### 24 GW Almazora

An itinerary through the region of marble, on the slopes of the Filabres Mountains.



- 36 km.
- Compacted gravel and asphalt in some sections.
- Among El Hijate, near the junction of the A-334 road and the municipal limits of Olula del Río and Fines.
- Alcóntar, Serón, Tijola, Armuña de Almazora, Purchena, Olula del Río.



### 25 GW Almazora. Section Huércal-Overa

Through the Almazora river basin.



- 13 km.
- Natural gravel.
- From the A7 motorway through Huércal Overa to the hamlet of Las Norias.
- Huércal-Overa.



### 26 GW Lucainena de las Torres

In the shadow of the Alhambilla mountains by Lucainena old mining railway between Torres and Agua Amarga.



- 5 km.
- Asphalt and compacted gravel mix.
- Lucainena de las Torres-Puente del Saltador to Rambla Honda.
- Lucainena de las Torres.
